

••• A Simple Guide to Reasonable Adjustments

What are Reasonable Adjustments?

Reasonable adjustments are changes made to remove barriers that might prevent a neurodivergent employee or freelancer from performing at their best. These adjustments are a legal right and promote an inclusive, supportive workplace.

Step 1: Open the Conversation

- Invite the employee/freelancer to discuss their needs confidentially
- Ask questions like: "What helps you work at your best?"
- Emphasise collaboration and support

Step 2: Identify Workplace Barriers

- Consider:
 - Tasks (e.g. reading large volumes of text)
 - Environment (e.g. noise, lighting)
 - Processes (e.g. back-to-back meetings)

Step 3: Explore Possible Adjustments Together

- Collaborate with the employee
- Common examples:
 - Flexible working hours or breaks
 - Quiet workspace or noise-cancelling headphones
 - Clear written instructions
 - Use of assistive software or tools
 - Adjusted performance metrics

Step 4: Trial the Adjustment

- Agree on a time-limited trial period (e.g. 4-6 weeks)
- Monitor the impact on both the employee and the role

Step 5: Review and Tweak

- Check in regularly
- Keep what works, change what doesn't
- Be flexible - needs may evolve over time



Top Tips

- **Avoid assumptions** - everyone's needs are different.
- Focus on **individual strengths** and how to enable them.
- Individuals may have their own **Access Passport** or **Rider** that identifies their requirements - this will help aid the process. Encourage all your workers who need one to have one.
- **Not everyone will know what they need straight away.** Support them through this by continuing to monitor anything that is put in place.
- **Document** all decisions and keep them **confidential**.
- Reasonable Adjustments don't need to be **costly**.



Quick Checklist

- Have I listened to the employee's needs?
- Have I identified any barriers to their work?
- Have I discussed possible solutions with them?
- Have I trialled the agreed adjustments?
- Have I followed up and reviewed the outcome?
